ENERGY STAR rebates on new appliance purchases

North Carolinians will save on major appliances during Earth Day Weekend, Thursday April 22, through Sunday, April 25.

A 15% rebate will be offered for qualified ENERGY STAR clothes washers, dishwashers, refrigerators and freezers. To be eligible, the North Carolina resident must be replacing an older appliance with a new ENERGY STAR appliance. Energy savings by switching to an ENERGY STAR appliance can be significant. For example, a new ENERGY STAR-rated refrigerator uses half the electricity that the same size refrigerator built before 1995 uses.



Kite safety is everyone's responsibility

April means that spring is here. Hatteras Island will once again have colorful kites of all shapes and sizes flying overhead. The prevailing winds and wide beaches make kiting a fun family tradition. Others will enjoy the very popular sport of kiteboarding. Kiteboarding is a form of wakeboarding where the rider is pulled by a kite



instead of a boat. The rider stands on a board and a large kite is used to catch wind, which pulls the rider across the water. Hatteras Island is internationally recognized as one of the best places to kiteboard in the world.

Hatteras Island has retail stores to meet all of your kite needs. These stores carry traditional kites, stunt kites, power kites along with kiteboarding equipment. Some also offer lessons.

Kiting can be an enjoyable activity—please kite responsibly. With any recreational activity there are safety issues that need to be addressed. Kites can become entangled in electric power lines and serious injury and or loss of life can result. Please take note of these safety tips before you kite.

✓ Check the area around and above you to make sure there are NO POWER LINES in the area.

✓ Winds can become strong and take the kite and flyer in directions not intended. STAY CLEAR OF POWER LINES.

✓ Never kite alone.
